Lucíle Belle Níchols December 22, 1909 - December 11, 2010

Sister of Ralph M. Nichols, former Director of WPM, who passed on July 5, 2010, **Lucile B. Nichols** went into the presence of her Lord just days short of celebrating her 101st birthday. She was preceded in death by her parents and all of her siblings: four brothers and three sisters.

Lucile accepted Christ as her Savior during the 1920's. She never married. She served as a nurse anesthetist in Egypt under the American Mission Hospital from 1935 until 1939 and later from 1945 until 1952.

In retirement, she was actively involved as a volunteer here at the office of WPM and much beloved by all. During the closing months of her earthly sojourn, she received excellent care from her brother, Ralph, and her niece, Helen May Nichols.

For twenty years she longed to be home with her Lord. At last she now beholds His glory.
