




Welcome to our 2010 Year End Summary. We hope the visuals will help you track our progress and areas of need. The graphs show five year increments plus the last three years.


THE MISSION: To offer free Bible correspondence courses to prisoners of Texas and Louisiana. Many will meet Christ for the first time; many more will be prodigals coming home and maturing as disciples. To that end we shipped 102,384 courses in 2010 and 400 volunteers counseled on 65,526 exams.




<u>NEW ENROLLEES:</u> Our new bright green enrollment card is our main evangelistic tool. For 2010 there were 11,487 new inmates asking for a course. Each course is mailed with an enrollment card so that the current student can be a witness to those nearby.




THE STUDENTS: By year's end we had climbed to 8,230 active students from an earlier low of 7,019. For those who have not returned a completed exam within 90 days, we follow up with a "You've Been Missed" postcard. Because of their circumstances, these men and women need much encouragement.




PROFESSIONS: *BORN TO WIN* is the first of five courses mailed to assess the student's spiritual status. In 2010 we obtained 567 professions of faith or an average of 47 per month. Their delightful testimonies can be read in our monthly newsletter.





INCOME/EXPENSES: Like most non-profits, our mission is totally supported by those individuals, churches, and grantors who understand God's heart of compassion and mercy. And like most faith-based organizations, we have felt the pinch over the last several years as gifts have decreased. For 2010 our average monthly support is about \$3,200 short of the costs to maintain our program.



Postage (45.53%), Books (30.29%) and Printing (7.33%) account for 83% of our budget. Printing includes all our envelopes, forms, letters, and the monthly newsletters. Several years ago cost-cutting measure were implemented, but they also affected our outreach. We don't want to diminish our mission, as long as inmates are requesting help.

Therefore, this year we will be promoting several Project Funding to aid meeting our goals. Your participation with us is greatly needed as we near night "when no one can work." John 9:4
