A TRIBUTE TO VOLUNTEERS

One of the most valuable assets of WPM is its volunteers, all 400+ of them! They work within 32 "Branches" out of various churches in Texas and Louisiana and in the office. The tasks volunteers do are so varied, it is impossible to create a complete list. They include: getting the mail... opening the mail... enrolling new students...grading exams... praying for and encouraging the students...posting grades... sending certificates with completed exams...printing envelopes and forms... tracking transferred students...pulling, stuffing, and mailing new courses... making deposits...writing students who fail courses... and maintaining the computer system, the physical facility and the grounds.

Many send donations in addition to the many hours they spend in service! Each would assert that they are blessed in giving by receiving a greater blessing. What could be more satisfying than observing first-hand Adam's broken race proclaiming their redemption and extolling their Savior? Those kinds of comments are very encouraging.

Studies indicate the United States is the "most advanced country in philanthropy" in the percentage of income allotted to charities and the average number of hours devoted to volunteerism. We have never logged volunteer hours, but the national average is about 24 hours per month. Our Grader/Counselors may spend that much time a month. Branch Managers certainly do more. But others may come to the office for several hours a week, or one day a week, and some for all five days a week.

What are some of our pressing needs? We earnestly desire your prayers for God's wisdom, guidance, and direction. We work diligently to accomplish the mission that God has given us to reach the incarcerated for Christ. Would you also pray God for God's provision so we can meet our financial needs?

In the Garland office we could use someone who knows Quick-Books, perhaps one day a week. Another area of need is help in tracking transferred students and resending returned items from the post office. Many more students are completing the curriculum and that requires more time writing letters of congratulations, compiling transcripts, and forwarding this information to the Dubuque office. If you live near one of the Branches, they would be very happy to have additional graders. We can provide phone numbers!

More than one in every four American adults volunteers. That represents the equivalent of nine million full-time workers at a value of \$239 billion! You can be sure we value our volunteers! The former Director, Ralph Nichols, was always concerned how best to show appreciation to our volunteers. But with so many, I

think he finally decided the Lord would have the last word at their Homecoming! "Well done, good and faithful servant."

The type of organization where people volunteer most is "religious" in nature (33.9%). That's because volunteering is an expression of our gratitude to the Lord for His work of Grace in our lives. We are "His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works (Eph.2:10). Jesus stated in John 5:17, "My Father has been working until now, and I have been working." Likewise, we also go into the Harvest to work.

Our volunteers are more than numbers! They are the saints of God serving in the manner as their Savior did. Volunteer today and find your place in the big picture!
