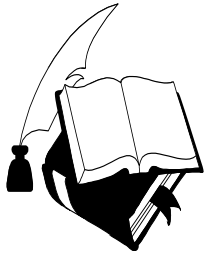

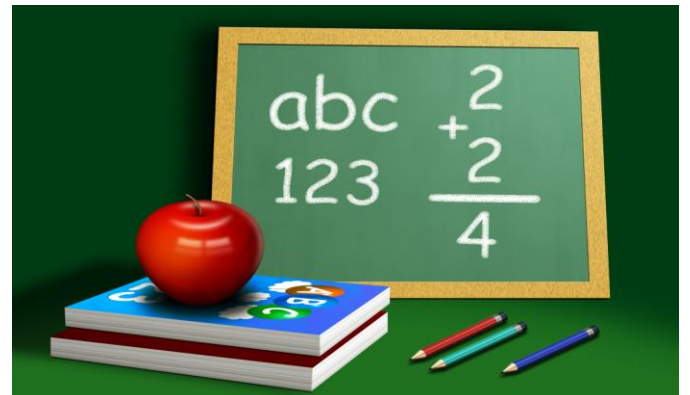

"This makes the second or third error I have found and brought to your attention. The seriousness of the consequences is why I am writing you. This course (*Ephesians*) talks about five gifts but then it was suggested that the first two were primarily concerned with the foundation of the church and then they passed on when the complete Word of God was given. That is not Scriptural; nowhere in the Bible does it say that happened. Please know how vitally important it is to teach the absolute truth because God will hold teachers more accountable. WHAT WOULD YOU SAY?

“The first lesson you sent me I cannot do or pass on to someone else. This is because I believe deep in my heart, mind, and spirit that it is a lie as to what God’s Word plainly teaches on salvation. Here are the steps of salvation the Word of God truly teaches: Hearing, Believe, Repent, Confess, and Baptism. Jesus shed His blood, so in baptism we are contacting His blood to cleanse our sins. A prayer standing alone does not obey the gospel. In the book of Acts not once was anyone told so say a prayer for Jesus to come into their heart and cleanse them from their sins. You are condemned making baptism a totally worthless act.” **Lance**

“Sorry, but I will not continue to study in your course. It is too human-based, self-improvement-based, and conscious-of-sin-based. My teaching that I receive from God is his Grace and to only focus on Christ and what he has finished for me at the cross. Jesus said it is finished (John 19:30); God said it is done (Revelation 16:17). And what do I say? As Jesus is, so am I. I’m complete in Christ. I am the Righteousness of God in Christ through Jesus’ blood” **Jon Paul**

“I’ve been doing your Bible studies and enjoying them since I first became incarcerated. Not until this one [*Doing Time with Jesus*] have I encountered such an obvious jaded, self-willed, one-sided, preconception, of any subject as I did the chapter on homosexuality. I’m not saying you are right or wrong about the sin. But you may want to get involved with prisoners on a more personal level and get a better sense of what we deal with as a threat. You stopped addressing the subject and started attacking the person. It’s this close-minded, pre-decided approach that keeps individuals from ever really addressing the issue. I implore you to be careful what you send into the prison system to be handled by some minds that have been damaged by this subject. Then you do what general society does and that is to associate homosexuality with pedophiles. Come on, talk about not acting and thinking like the world! I’ve reached my growth experience with you guys.” **Kerwin**

“During the time I was taking your courses it became apparent that my answers were other than what you expected. You then mistook this as poor motivation or learning skills, when in truth it is a fundamental difference of Scriptural observance. For one, I don’t believe that Torah (the law) was ever abolished or ‘nailed to the cross.’ I believe in keeping the seventh day Sabbath. I do not view the Father, Son, and Spirit as a trinity of equals. I do not observe Easter or Christmas.” **Robert**
